Royal National Lifeboat Institution

Paul and Linda came in to talk to the children in 2^{nd} , 4^{th} , 5^{th} and 6^{th} class about water safety. There are 44 lifeboat stations in Ireland. They are situated in Ireland, England, Scotland and Wales. They rescue 7000 people per year and 80% of the people can't swim. It costs 150,000,000 to keep the RNLI business running and it costs 15,000,000 for Ireland. The RNLI is a charity business, 99% of the money is donated from the heart not the government. There are 4,500 crew volunteers who don't get paid they just do it because they like rescuing people. They work 365 days in the year through all sorts of weather such as thunder, lightning, rain and storms. If in trouble on any water e.g. lakes, rivers or canals call 999 and ask for the coast
